 robed in light as with a cloak.

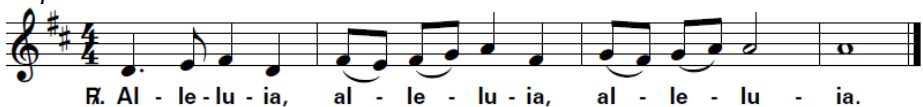

 and you renew the face of the earth. **R./**



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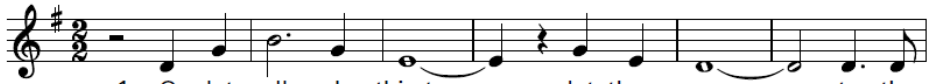
